Student Scholarship Essay Application

Scholarship dollars will be awarded to students interested in furthering their education at the John T. Blong Technology Center, part of Eastern Iowa Community Colleges, to pursue a career in advanced manufacturing.

Official Rules:

Award Value: \$2,500 for each of two scholarships

Entry deadline: 4:30 p.m. Monday, November 4, 2011

Award Date: December 2011; winner will be notified by mail

Who Can Apply: Any high school student who attends the 2011 Junior Achievement High School Advanced Manufacturing Career Expo.

Details: Each student may enter only one essay (500 words or less). The essay must have a title. Entries must follow the following rules: The essay must be typed, double-spaced, and in English. **Handwritten essays or essays presented in any other way will be disqualified.** Entry form must be included. DO NOT put your name on the essay. The essay entry must include entrant's home telephone number, including area code, typed in the upper right-hand corner of each page. It must be the same number as that listed on the entry form.

All essays and all rights to their publication become the property of Junior Achievement of the Heartland, which may use, edit and excerpt these entries for promotional or any other purpose, including placing them online (e.g., on www.jaheartland.org) without attribution or compensation, additional or otherwise. Junior Achievement of the Heartland reserves the right to use prizewinners' names and hometowns in any advertising or promotional materials relating to this competition without further notification, permission, or compensation to the winners, except where prohibited by law.

Requirements: The scholarship recipient must be currently attending a public, private or home high school. All scholarship awards are valid only for attendance at the John T. Blong Technology Center (EICC). All scholarship awards must be utilized within two (2) years of the Award Activation Date on the certificate. Scholarships not used within their specified time frame will be forfeited. A scholarship may not be applied retroactively – to an event that the recipient has already registered/applied for, has already attended or for an item the recipient has already ordered. Documentation from the John T. Blong Technology Center as proof of acceptance must be submitted before disbursement will be completed. Please note that Junior Achievement of the Heartland reserves the right to request evidence of a recipient's registration and attendance prior to the award of this scholarship.
